French Immersion Camp Core Elements

The core elements of the French Immersion Camps include:

- **French Learning** activities where children read, write, and speak and express themselves in French
- **Active Games.** Research has demonstrated that children learn better when they are active. Our camps are designed to add the right amount of "activeness" at the SportsDome. This will increase your child's level of learning and allow your child to learn better, faster, and retain more information.
- **Safe Environment.** See our COVID-19 Precautions section.
- **FUN.** Our motto is to Play, Have Fun, Enjoy Life !!! Your child will have FUN with us.
- **Social.** Your child will be exposed to social games, social activities, and allow them to develop their social skills and make new friends.
- **Learning Mode.** Your child's mind will go into learning mode again, which will open their minds to learn other things.

Camp Week and Hours

The camps are offered for the duration of one week, Monday to Friday from 9:00am to 4:00pm. We offer early morning drop off at 7:30 for parents that need to drop off early due to work. We also offer a late pickup service until 5:30. Both services are offered at no additional cost.

A Day at the French Immersion Camp

A typical day at the camp will look like the following:

- 7:30 – Early morning drop off
- 9:00 – Ice-breaker activity
- 9:15 – Rock, paper, scissors
- 9:45 – Caterpillar race
- 10:30 – Snack break
- 10:45 – Ice-breaker bingo (French learning activity)
- 11:15 – Graffiti and stories (French learning activity)
- 11:45 – Lunch
- 12:15 – Walk to Centennial Park (Dome is 5-minute walk to Centennial Park)
- 1:00 – Jeopardy Vocabulary (French learning activity)
- 1:45 – Gaga Ball
- 2:15 – British Columbia
- 2:45 – Snack break
- 3:00 – Pictionary (drawing and players must guess the images in French !)
- 3:30 – Water games !!
- 4:00 – Late pickup – FREE Play where the children play games they want until parent/guardian arrives

Key Benefits of the Camp

- Learn French by reading, writing, drawing, speaking, expressing themselves throughout the entire week
- Perfect time to learn again because of limited learning opportunities since the pandemic started
- Active games will allow children to learn better, faster, and retain more information
- Develop social skills and make new friends

- Allows campers to be in a positive environment and get in a positive state of mind

Safe Environment – COVID-19 Precautions

The SportsDome's Full Circle Academy Daycare provided childcare services **during the pandemic** for essential workers. In order to provide services, we implemented a number of precautions. On Tuesday, May 19, we opened our daycare and camps to our community. As such, we have implemented the following COVID-19 precautions:

1. Front Door Locked

The front door will remain locked at all times so that we can control the amount of people entering the facility. **Only** daycare/camps children and staff will be permitted inside. There is a door bell at the door. Press on it if no one is around.

2. Key Strategies to prevent and control the Spread of Covid -19

We will be screening each child daily for any of the symptoms below and taking their temperature upon arrival.

Parents must also complete the Screening questionnaire each day upon drop off. The questionnaire will be emailed in advance to you once you have registered for the camp.

All children and staff who are sick with 2 or more of the following symptoms, will **NOT** be permitted entrance to the facility.

- Fever
- New cough or worsening chronic cough
- runny nose
- headache
- Sore Throat
- New onset of Fatigue
- New onset of Muscle Pain
- Diarrhea
- Loss of Taste or Smell

Note: Children or staff who have been identified as having seasonal allergies or who suffer from chronic runny nose/nasal congestion are not required to be excluded.

If a child develops any of the above symptoms while at the center we will contact you immediately, and the child will be removed from the group and brought to the office so that they can isolate until you pick them up. Parents have 1 hour from the initial call to pick up their child. If your child develops symptoms while not at daycare/camps and will not be attending daycare/camps, you must contact the center and disclose all symptoms so we can properly document any illnesses.

3. Personal Hygiene Etiquette

Please review with your child proper Personal Hygiene Etiquette

- Avoid Touching face, eyes, nose or mouth especially with unwashed hands
- Cover mouth and nose with disposable tissue or with the crease of the elbow with coughing or sneezing.

4. Groups

We will be separating the children in groups of 15 or less with one staff member and keeping this little family together for the entire week to help promote physical and social distancing and keep children exposure to new staff at a minimum. Each group will have their own cubbies and their own tables that will not be shared with other groups. Each Group will also have their own bucket of supplies to use during the week.



Meal times for each group will be staggered to promote physical distancing and allow ample time for our staff to properly clean and disinfect the area so it will be ready for the next group. Children will be required to wash hand before and after each meal. Children will **NOT** be permitted to share food. We will still have access to the microwave for those children who have a heated meal. 1 staff member will be responsible to heat the meals and cleaning and disinfecting the microwave and kitchen area after each use.

Children are **NOT** to bring any toys from home especially blankets, stuffed animals, play dough, slime and puzzles as these are not able to be properly cleaned.

5. Additional Steps We have taken

We have added additional hand sanitizing stations and regular hand washing to our daily routine. We have also increased our daily cleaning and sanitizing of our tables, toys and equipment.

We have increased our cleaning and disinfection policies to several times per day. All toys (ie Lego, Blocks, Kenix etc..) will be cleaned between group uses as well as at the beginning and end of each day.



Bathrooms will be cleaned and sanitized 3 times per day: morning, afternoon and end of day.

Added physical distancing measures.

We have an Outbreak Management Plan in the case something happens with an outbreak.

We have added training for our employees.

Children must have a water bottle every day. This will help reduce the amount of movement around the center and limit the contact with the water fountain.

6. Financial Assistance

If your family was financially impacted by the Covid-19, daycare assistance has expanded their eligibility requirements to offer financial funding support, to help family's get their children back to daycare so they can return to work.

7. List of People

Department of Education and early childhood are requiring us to have an updated list of all people living in your household listed on your child's profile. You will be sent an email by our team and you will need to respond and provide a list of names and contact numbers of all people living at your address whether it is permanent or just temporary.

8. Field Trips

During this time Field Trips for which we have to travel on the bus or in vehicles are prohibited. However, walking and outside activities are encouraged. In order to promote healthy and active lifestyle we will be outside a minimum of 2 hours per day whether pending so please make sure that your children have appropriate clothing.

9. Morning Drop Off Procedure

Once you arrive, one of us will greet you at the door.

We will be screening each child daily for any symptoms.

We will take their temperature with an infrared thermometer.

We will collect a questionnaire from you that must be filled out daily.

Children entering are expected to sanitize or wash their hands upon entering.

10. What to Bring What Not to Bring

- Water Bottle
- Face Mask (optional)
- 2 snacks and a lunch
- Inside shoes
- DO NOT bring toys from home (blankets, stuffed animals, playdough, slime, puzzle, etc)

11. End of Day Pickup Process (DRIVE THRU) !!!

Call us 15 minutes before you arrive at **382-7529** to let us know that you are on the way and one of our staff will prepare your child(ren) and meet you at the door when you arrive.
